This is Cody's Story.

This all started August of 2014. We noticed a small lump the size of a pinky fingernail on the left side of his neck. We went to several doctors, and even had a biopsy taken.. the results came back as Neurofibromatosis and it was non malignant. The doctors said don't worry about it unless it began to hurt. So January 2015, we took Cody to UAB several times, and were told by them that as long as it wasn't hurting him it was fine. By July 2015 this small mass had began to grow. It was so large the doctor said it needed to come out. They scheduled surgery for October since it was not cancer. When October 15, 2015 came, the doctor removed the mass. It was 6 inches by 15cm. When the biopsy came back it was Cancer, Spindle Cell Carcinoma. The doctor was certain he got everything. In November 2015, they performed a PET scan, and results came back all clear. In December Cody had a hernia surgery. On January 6, 2016 he had his 2 month post op check up with the surgeon from the neck surgery. They examined him and found out the mass had

come back. They wanted to schedule surgery for February 22, 2016. After persisting the severity of this we asked if there was anything earlier. The doctor checked and said ok, January 21, 2016. When the doctor left the room Cody and his sister noticed he left his appointment book. They prayed over it and prayed that it would work out in Cody's favor. While getting blood work after that appointment the nurse came running to find us at 445 on a Wednesday, Jan. 6., and said they had a 12 hour surgery cancelation for the 8th if he could make it. We said YES! (The appointment book prayer came to pass!) After that surgery on his neck January 8, 2016 the pathology was indeed spindle cell carcinoma and was attached to many things. Cody's left jugular was removed, muscle in his shoulder, nerve to his left vocal chord, nerve to his lip, all lymph nodes, (this was a radical neck dissection). Cody began radiation January 21, 2016 at UAB and had to stay at the Hope Lodge for the duration for the treatments. 33 total. He made it through 12 treatments. After the 12th one he became very ill. He went to the ER at UAB same day and they had discovered he had a mass in his small intestines. He also had to receive 2 blood transfusions. They performed an emergency intussusception. They removed 20 cm of his intestines and a 2 cm mass. He remained in the hospital for a week. The pathology came back the same as the others. They wanted him to begin chemo immediately. On Feb 11, 2016 he received his first treatment. And on March 11, 2016 he received the second. Upon his pre-treatment work up they found he had nodules in his lungs. He had a bronchoscopy for the lungs on April 12, 2016. The pathology stated he had organized pneumonia and a fungal infection. He has begun medication for that. Shortly after the 26th of April he began having issues walking and sitting. He was in excruciating pain. Went to the ER, and they didn't find anything. We then began to reach out to MD Anderson in Houston. They set an appointment for the June 28, 2016, which was 2 months away. The pain never let up so on May 9, 2016 he went to the family doctor and had a MRI of his hip and leg. The findings were a soft tissue mass on his hip that was 13 cm. After visiting an oncologist on May 15, 2016 it was deemed best if Cody began radiation to relieve some pain. Since then he has had 4 treatments. The doctors are working on a treatment plan. Since day 1, Cody has claimed he IS healed! We believe it, and we receive it in the name of his Jesus!
